## TRADE TABLES

Conference and May Schools

The State Handcraft Committee has available sales tables at both school to allow members to sell items and equipment. One is an Open Trade Table and the other is a Commission Table.

## Trade Table

To be able to put anything on the Commission Table, you need to first make a donation of no less than two items to the Trade Table. More would be appreciated. The Trade Table will remain the property of the State Handcraft Committee however if the Host Division wishes to hold a Trade Table of their own that is permissible but must be keep completely away from the State Handcraft Table.

## Commission Table

It is essential that you attach with the items a complete list of items and their price. (I suggest you keep a copy for yourself as well). This needs to be a very detailed list. For example if you are selling pattern books, we need each book to be identified and priced. Any ribbon etc will need to be cut and sold in lengths (eg. 20 skeins at $\$ 2.00$ not just so much a metre). There is no time to be measuring and sorting on the day. Anyone putting items on the Commission Table MUST be prepared to pay the State Handcraft Committee 20\% commission as per the State By-Laws.

## Pricing

All items need to be priced individually.

## What can be sold

The Conference Trade Table and May School Commission Tables are completely different. Following is a guideline of what can be sold at each event.

Conference - Trade Table and Commission Tables - Finished items, Nic Nac's etc. Nothing \$5.00 and under is allowed on the Commission Table at the State Conference. Anything $\$ 5.00$ or under will be moved to the Trade Table.

Conference School and May School - Equipment and unfinished items may be sold on these tables eg. Ribbons, buttons, wool, patterns, materials, kits etc. Pricing as marked. Nothing under $\$ 3.00$ to be sold on the Commission Table.
